Facing challenges, learning from the experience, and being able to bounce back is an important life skill.

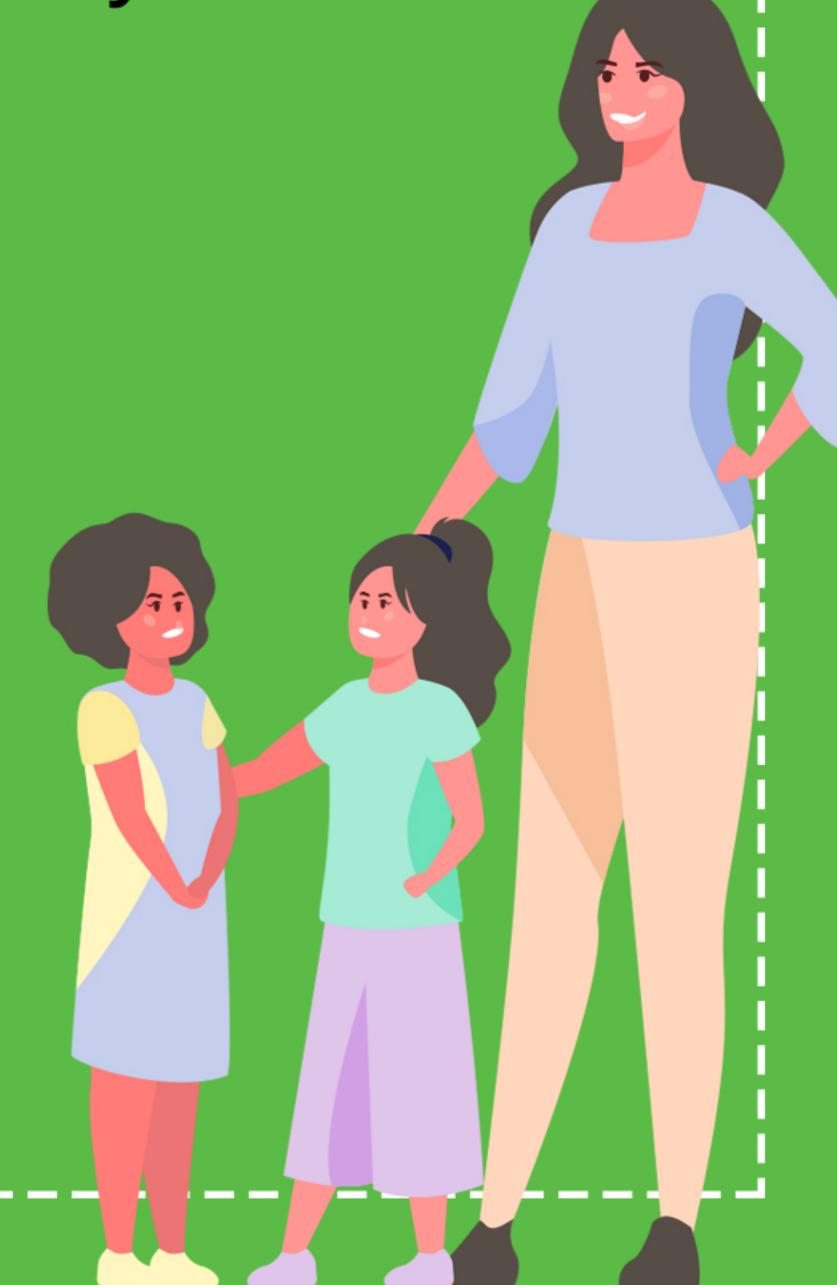
Solution: Whether it's riding their bike or tying a lace, let your child challenge their abilities by taking up responsibilities for tasks and seeing it through.
